Financial Stewardship Guidelines During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Health concerns within the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the response of our diocese and parishes, mean we are doing all that we can to be part of the wider community and balance caution, safety, opportunities to worship and the provision of pastoral care.

One question that is very important for diocesan and parish leadership is, how can we continue to practice financial stewardship when we are not gathering for worship?

The following are a few guidelines to consider and follow:

- Hand deliver or surface mail your offering to your parish office or congregational/parish treasurer. Consider increasing your financial gift or make a one-time extra contribution to help ensure your parish meet its financial obligations.
- 2. Consider registering your parish with the online giving provider Canada Helps. For more information, please check their website canadahelps.org
- 3. Begin (or modify) Pre-Authorized Giving. The Diocese of Ontario established this giving plan to assist you in your support of the work of your parish through your regular offering. It is convenient for the donor because your offering is automatically received every month and there is peace of mind knowing that you will provide continual support of your parish. It enables Churchwardens and Treasurers to plan better through regular and dependable contributions.
