4. Business Arising from the Minutes

#### a. List for Devotions

AD David asked Council members to sign up for the monthly devotions and passed around a list for sign up. The list is also online.

#### b. Explanation of General Synod (from 10 December)

The Bishop provided information on the Diocesan apportionment for the Anglican Church of Canada (\$110,000 budgeted for 2025). An examination of the ACC role and operations is part of the Primate's Commission currently underway. The ACC as a national church has a large role to play in international affairs of the Church. However, are there more efficient ways to operate? Among questions being asked is do we need a full time primate? Only Canada and the US churches have a full time primate; other communions elect a bishop who carries on Diocesan work as well as national work. The recommendations of the Primate's Commission will be discussed at General Synod in June.

## c. Resolution from 2023 Synod on Water Susan Withers/DFO

The Green Group's investment committee investigated the nature of investments in companies, specifically Coca Cola, and determined that this company is in fact very responsible in its use of water. Susan Withers said they are satisfied that Coca Cola can remain in the portfolio. A webcast is planned for delegates before Synod regarding (environment social governance) ESG scorings re: ethical investing with representative from Wood Gundy to fully discuss.

Valerie Smith is willing to write to each parish re: being a Blue Church. Revocation of motion from 2023 can be presented in the circular.

# a. Allocation for LTh Huron College Bishop/Grayhame Bowcott

The Rev. Canon Dr. Grayhame Bowcott, Director of Huron's Licentiate in Theology made a presentation on the program which is intended to provide training to laity and potential deacons at a convenient and reasonably affordable method. Grahame is proposing that the Diocese purchase a subscription of \$5000 which will allow all interested persons to participate in the courses offered by the Licentiate program at no cost to them. Our Diocese received \$5000 for education from Ed Dallow's family for clergy education. Bishop William suggests Synod Council support the LTh program with these monies.
